Change for Global Change is excited to announce the kick-off of our Second Annual "Walk a Mile in Their Shoes" Walkathon. This year's walkathon will once again ask participants to walk a minimum of 4 miles (either in a day, over the course of a week, or over 4 weeks) in solidarity with millions of people around the world, primarily women and children, who are forced to walk an average of 4 miles a day to fetch clean water for their family.

Registration is open now to sign up as a walker/fundraiser. Information is available on the <u>Change</u> <u>for Global Change website</u>. Participants can sign up as an individual or as a team. Participants are asked to complete their walk of 4 miles (or more) between October 4th (Feast of St Francis) and October 24th (International Day of Climate Action). Donations are also being accepted online.

Change for Global Change is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, **founded by the Sisters of Saint** Joseph of Philadelphia in 2006, as a practical way to respond to the needs of Earth and those who lack the means for a sustainable life. In union with our Sisters and Associates of the U.S. Federation and the worldwide "Family of St. Joseph," we serve the "dear neighbor" – every person on the planet – by doing all we can to make our home, Earth, sustainable for all.
